who, after being duly sworn did depose and say:

My name is Roger Craig. On November 22, 1963, the day of the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, I was a Deputy Sheriff of the Dallas County Sheriff's Department. In the course of my duties on that date at approximately 12:40 or 12:50 P.M. on the steps of the Texas School Book Depository Building in Dallas, I spoke with a man who represented himself as a Secret Service agent. This man was standing among some Dallas policemen and I gave this man information I had concerning Mr. and Mrs. Rowland and the rifle and also information about the Rambler station wagon, but the man did not show any interest whatsoever concerning the information about the Rambler station wagon.

This man spoke with a smooth voice, was approximately 5'10" in height, and had hair darker than blonde but not very dark.

I identify this man from the newspaper clipping which I have initialed and which is attached and state that I am positive that this man was EDGAR E. BRADLEY.
