SUBJECT: Identity of Assessin

I think a thorough investigation should be run on a TSHD employee memod Jack Dougherty.

On the morning of Hovember 22, Dougherty was part of a crow laying a new plywood floor on the minth floor of the TEHD. This crew consisted of Donny Arce, Dougherty, Charles Givens, James ("Junior") James, Billy Lovelady, and Bunnie Ree Villians, all regular employees in the TEHD shipping and order filling department. They were apparently working under the direction of Villian Shelley the senior employees in that department.

In a written statement to the Dallas police on November 22, Dougherty gave the following story: On the norming of November 22, he had worked [with the floor laying crew] on the ninth floor until 12:00, when he went down to the first floor to eat his lunch. After lanch he returned to work [on the sixth floor] and then went down to the fifth floor "to get some stock," when he heard a shot, which sounded as if it had come from inside the building. He then went down to the first floor and saked Eddie Piper, the TEDD junitor, whether Piper had heard anything. Piper said yes, he had heard 3 shots. Dougherty then returned to the sixth floor. EA Blake of the Eccret Service, who interviewed Dougherty between December 2 and December 5, reported that "when Dougherty was interviewed, be seemed to be very confused about time and places. Mr. Truly [Roy S. Truly, Superintendent of the IEED] furnished the information that olthough Dougherty is a very good employee and a hard worker, he is mentally retorded and has difficulty in remembering facto, such as detes, times, places, and has been especially confused since the associantion." (SS 491 at p. 7)

I am suspicious of Dougherty for several rescons.

- (1) he has no elibi. Of the mix employees on the floor laying cross, Givens claims to have been with a friend at a parking lot several blocks many when the assessimation took place; Williams and James were together on the fifth floor with another employee named Horman; Lovelady was standing outside the TEED (and was photographed); and Arce claims to have been standing outside the TEED.

  Dougherty was inside the TEED and all alone.
  - (2) His story is very thin.
- (a) It does not sake sense that Dougherty, one of a sixran floor laying crew, should begin working before the other five numbers returned from lunch.
- (b) It is questionable that Dougherty would have had to go to the fifth floor to get "stock" in connection with the floor laying project.

<sup>1/</sup> Dougherty's father told the FMI that Dougherty had received a medical discharge from the U.S. Army and had considerable difficulty coordinating his mental facilities and his speech. (5.367)

- (c) Jarren, Horenn, and Williams, who were at the contheast window of the fifth floor at the time of the assassination, and ran from there to the southwest window, make absolutely no mention of having seen Dougherty on the fifth floor.
- (d) It does not seem credible that Dougherty would have gone down to the first floor, found out that three shots had been fired, and then essently returned to the sixth floor.
- (e) No report indicates that Bougherty or sayons else was on the sixth floor when that floor was sourched.
- (f) Since Dougherty heard the shots on the fifth floor, and since the shots were fired at approximately 12:32, Dougherty must have returned to the sixth floor, allegedly to go back to work, before 12:30. This seems odd, since the THED lunch period extends until 12:45.
- (3) If Dougherty is "mentally retarded," it may explain some of the inconsistencies in his story. On the other hand, the "mental retardation" may be an emotional problem, which would itself be grounds for sumpleion. In this connection, I find distarting Truly's comment that Dougherty "has been especially confused since the association."
