I made detail at 9:00 s.m. on November 22, 1963. I received my instructions from Captain Lawrence who instructed us to work traffic; watch the people in the crowd to see they didn't throw anything at the President or his motorcade and that it was lawful for people to carry placerds but not throw then. Captain Lawrence told us to stop the cars when the motorcade came through,

I was assigned to Bla and Houston not later than 10:00 a.m. and stayed on my assignment until the motorcade case through, I was on my assignment at 10:00 a.m. I was on the morthwest corner of Bla and Houston.

I checked the Texas Depository Building around 11:00 a.m. and it was calning and all windows were closed. I talked to some people from the building who wanted to know what time the potorcude would come by. They stated that the building was full of people and they wanted to see the President and Mrs. Kennedy. I advised then to come out on the corner at 11:45 aim. and at that time close to 100 people came out and lined the sidewalks. When the softercade came through, I beloed atop Min Street and the Southbound traffic on Houston, I also stopped traffic on the small attest which runs directly in front of the Depository Buildies which dead-ends into the railroad track from Bim ant Monaton.

When the shots were fired, I looked up and could not see shypne or anything extending out of the windows. I thought the shots were coming from top of the building,
